

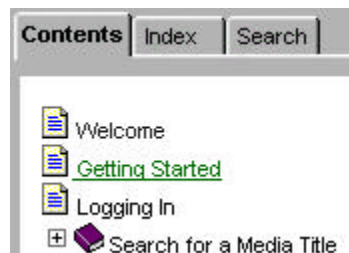
Quick User's Guide for Macintosh


The first step...

Downloading the Windows Media Player™ for Macintosh

In order to view videos on unitedstreaming.com, it is necessary to download and install the Windows Media Player™ on to your computer. Here are the step-by-step instructions for a Macintosh:

1. Visit www.unitedstreaming.com and enter your username and password.
2. Click on ONLINE HELP at the top of the web page.
3. Click on Getting Started as shown below:



4. Click on:
 [Download](#) the appropriate Microsoft® Windows Media Player™ for your computer.
5. You will be taken to the Microsoft Download page. Scroll down until you see the following and click on Download Now.

6. After the download is complete, look on your desktop for the Windows Media Installer™ Folder and double click on it:



7. The Windows Media Installer™ will then appear. Double click on this Icon:



8. Follow each of the installation steps. After installing the Media Player™, your computer will restart.

Selecting the Video to Stream/Download

Step 1: Select one of the titles that matches your search by clicking on the title.

Water's Structure

Explains that water's unique characteristics result from the structure of the water molecule. Using a Hoffman apparatus, students discover that water can be decomposed to one part oxygen and two parts hydrogen. In another lab, they discover water is a polar molecule, attracted to both positive and negative charges. This history of the atomic model is explored, from the days of alchemists to present day. Bohr's model is used to explain how hydrogen and oxygen form a covalent bond.

Click on the **s** button to stream the video. To view in Full Screen, Go to “**View**” > “**Full Screen**”

Downloading the video




Internet Explorer:

1. Hover your mouse over the **d** button and click and hold.
2. Click and scroll down the pop-up menu that appears to “**Download Link to Disk...**”.
3. You will see a pop-up screen that asks you to save your video clip. You may give your video a different name. Navigate to a folder to save your video. (We suggest downloading to the desktop or creating a video folder).
4. Save the file extension (“.asf”)



Netscape Navigator:

1. Hover your mouse over the  button and right click and hold.
2. Click and scroll down the pop-up menu that appears to “**Save Link As...**”.
3. In your window, select “**Source**” under the pop-up menu that appears. Do not save as a “text” file.
4. Follow step 4 above.

Finding and Playing Your Downloaded Video

If the downloaded video clip looks like this:



...Double click on the icon and your video will play.

If your downloaded video clip looks like this:



...Open your Windows Media Player application and then go to “**File**” > “**Open**” and find the file. Then your video will play.

Downloading Teachers’ Guides and Blackline Masters

A link for Teachers’ Guides and Blackline Masters (lessons and student activities) will be displayed above the title.

***Tip:** You must have Adobe Acrobat Reader to view the guides. If a “pdf” file does not appear, you must go to www.adobe.com to download their free “Acrobat” Reader”.

After you have selected a video, you can click on Blackline Masters or Teacher’s Guide. The file will be downloaded.

1. Navigate to where you save your downloads (the same place most likely where your downloaded videos are).

***Tip:** Some computers will download files to the desktop. Networked computers might have downloads saved to your network folder. Be sure to have “**All files**” showing under the field name.

2. Double click on the file to view.
