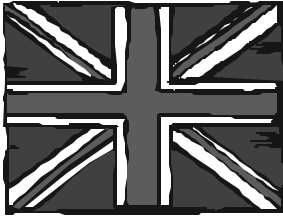

Using historical period locations, sets, and costumes as well as acting and language reflecting the American Colonial Era, this series explores the events and social history that led to the formation of the United States.

101. Family and Work in Revolutionary America:

The relationship of children and parents, husbands and wives, and how the role each person played affected colonial life, is re-enacted in this program. The close bonds of family members made this hard life endurable and brought most work close to home. (19 minutes)

102. Pioneer Life in Revolutionary America: The difficult, yet free life of the first wave of settlers to cross the Appalachian Mountains is colorfully re-enacted. The importance of this westward moving frontier to American values is made clear. (16 minutes)

103. Roanoke: The Lost Colony: Virginia Dare, the first child born in America, who was not a native, vanished with the rest of her colony. The poignancy and mystery of this loss is dramatized for young viewer in this re-telling of the story by her grandfather, John White, the only survivor of Roanoke. (17 minutes)

104. Social Class in Revolutionary America: Even though the availability of land gave American colonists more self-determination than their European cousins, there were still class divisions. This program explores how these differences were overcome as the Revolution approached. (19 minutes)

105. Values in Revolutionary America: The powerful influences of family, social class, religion, and self-government in the colonies created a unique set of values. This program uses historical vignettes to reveal those values on the eve of the Revolution. (19 minutes)

106. Jamestown: The Beginning: This live action program features realistic reenactments, both in Elizabethan England and America, at the beginning of the European settlement in the New World. Strong

acting plus historical costumes and sets add to the drama of the colony's disappearance. The National Education Media Network awarded this video its Gold Apple award. (27 minutes)
